

Exemptions From Attendance

Each child between the ages of 6 and 18 shall be subject to compulsory full-time education. (Education Code 48200)

The Board may grant exemptions from compulsory attendance to students as allowed by law and in the best interest of the student.

Exemptions shall not be used to remove students who are disciplinary problems. Suspension, expulsion, transfer to alternative programs and other administrative measures shall be used with these students.
